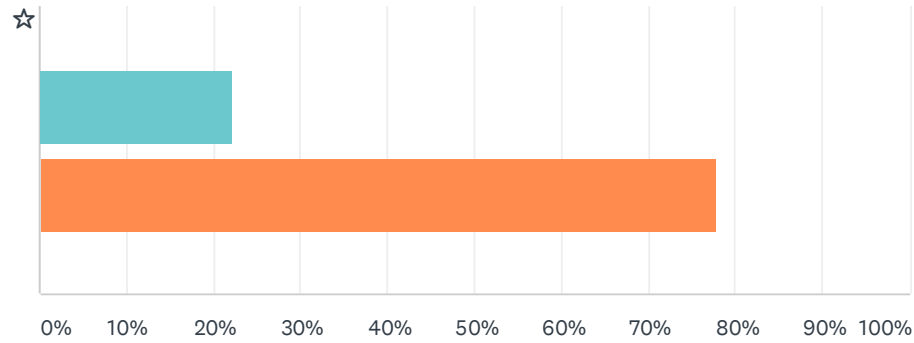

It's easy to follow what Ram was saying. The real-world examples were great. The 3 hour slots were perfect to be able to schedule in the time around my regular work. The content was very good, and was at a level that could be absorbed by both junior and seasoned Java developers. I liked how the Tier1App apps weren't punted as being the only/best way, but that he mentioned them and what their strengths were. It came across very balanced, and honest.

You don't have a space for it in this form, but I'd love it if Ram could give some training to our dev teams. I don't have a lot of control over that (ito approvals), but I'd love to chat about a proposal where we buy your yCrash software and then pay a fixed price for up to X number of seats. I'm prepared to motivate to those who can make it happen.
